The Kentucky Humane Society (KHS) requires photos showing, at a minimum; fencing, gates, pasture, a barn/shelter photo, and a photo showing the stall to be used for the adopted equine as well as any other equines owned by the applicant or housed on the property. KHS may ask for additional photos if details are unclear. All adopters must be 21 years of age or older.
